Message From The Board Chair



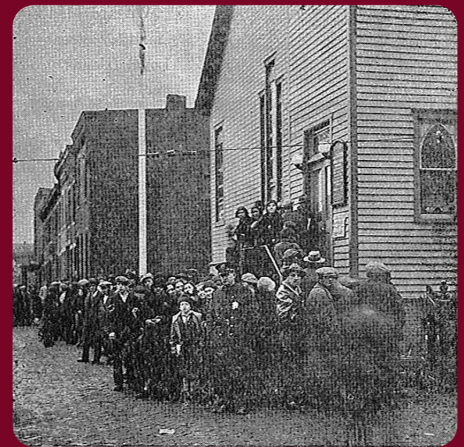
Dear Friends,

For nearly a century, Wiley Mission has sought to meet people where they are and respond to their needs with Christ-centered love and care.

During the Great Depression, Rev. John Hackett challenged our congregation to look beyond itself and care for those facing difficult circumstances. Whether providing food, encouragement, or hope, the mission was simple: demonstrate the love of Christ through practical acts of service. Guiding the Next Generation of Caregivers

Behind every confident nursing assistant is someone who took the time to teach, encourage, and support them along the way.

Wiley Mission’s CNA Mentor Program pairs experienced nursing assistants with newly hired student nursing assistants, creating a supportive environment where learning extends beyond the classroom. Our mentors help bridge the gap between education and hands-on caregiving, guiding new team members as they develop the skills, confidence, and compassion needed to provide exceptional care.



More than teachers, our mentors serve as role models. They help new caregivers build meaningful relationships with residents, learn the importance of teamwork, and understand what it means to be part of the Wiley Mission family. Through peer-to-peer education and encouragement, they help new staff feel welcomed, valued, and supported from their very first day.

The impact of the program extends far beyond orientation. By sharing their knowledge, experience, and heart for service, our mentors help prepare the next generation of caregivers to serve independently with confidence and compassion.

The Heart Behind The Care

A Shared Commitment to Care

For Rosa and her son Talan, Wiley Mission is more than a workplace—it is a place where they feel valued, supported, and part of a family.

Rosa serves as a Restorative Aide, while Talan works as an Activity Assistant, helping residents get where they need to go safely and comfortably each day. Their shared experience at Wiley Mission reflects the caring culture that has become a hallmark of the organization.

When asked what makes Wiley different, Rosa quickly points to the friendly atmosphere and the way employees are treated.

“You feel valued here. It’s a family atmosphere.”

That sense of trust means even more to Rosa because her son works alongside her.

“I feel safe here, and I feel safe leaving my son here when I’m not with him,” she says.



Talan's journey at Wiley began as a volunteer. His positive attitude and dedication quickly stood out, leading to his current position as a member of the transportation team. Today, he enjoys working with his co-workers and helping residents throughout the community.

"When Talan is scheduled to work, he goes to bed early because he wants to be ready for the next day," Rosa says proudly.

His commitment has not gone unnoticed. Co-workers consistently describe Talan as someone who is well-liked, dependable, and eager to help others. When asked to describe Wiley Mission in just a word or two, Rosa's response was heartfelt: "God is in all the details."

She recalls seeing the sign at the entrance that reads, "Jesus Loves You," and immediately feeling that Wiley Mission was where she belonged.

Today, Rosa hopes to retire from Wiley Mission—and she hopes Talan will continue building his future here as well.

Talan chose a single word to describe Wiley Mission:

"Courage."

It is a fitting choice. Courage has been part of Wiley Mission's story since its earliest days when Rev. John Hackett challenged his congregation during the Great Depression to meet the needs of those around them.

That same spirit of faith and service continues today.

As Scripture reminds us:

"Have I not commanded you? Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid; do not be discouraged, for the Lord your God will be with you wherever you go." (Joshua 1:9)

Rosa and Talan represent just two members of the Wiley Mission family, but their story reflects the dedication, compassion, and commitment demonstrated by employees across every ministry.

Together, they help carry out Wiley Mission's motto verse:

"For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in." (Matthew 25:35)

Building Community Across Generations

The Alpha Course (reboot) saw about 35 regular attendees and team members. Four attendees had no previous affiliation with Wiley, and we saw one gentlemen give his life to Christ as well as many who realized the need to live in the direction and power of the Holy Spirit. We have not confirmed a new Alpha Course at this time.

Our Youth Group although small in number, has been deepening relationships. During our Wednesday nights we have been teaching through much of Genesis, and sharing our stories. Many thanks to Ron Metzgar, who continues to support the group when his job allows, and also to Karen Moyer, whom The Spirit led to also join this important area of ministry.

What's Next?: This was the question asked by many after Alpha and the answer is Making Disciples. This will not be a class, a bible study or a new program, but simply meeting up regularly with several people that God leads together (just like Jesus with Peter, James and John) to help each other mature in an intentional, SIMPLE and DEEPER way.



Missions: We were blessed this past year to add Steve Hughes (Southwest Field) and the Saavedra Family (Mexico) to our prayer and support list, and also to be challenged by David and Melissa Raube (Philippines) and Wanne Thompson (Thailand). Soon we will be sharing more about our other missionaries and praying for God's direction for short term mission trips both near and far.

Wiley Church Children's Ministry

Shaping Children's Lives with God's Love — Today and for the Future

At Wiley Church, we believe children are not simply the future of the church—they are a vital part of the church today. Our desire is to help children know the love of Jesus, build a strong biblical foundation, and grow into lifelong followers of Christ. Every program is designed with the goal of shaping hearts and lives through God's truth, grace and love for both now and the years ahead.

Kids Klub

Kids Klub continues to be a strong and well-attended Wednesday evening ministry for children ages 3 years old through 5th grade. Each week includes Bible teaching, crafts, gym activities and snacks in a fun and faith-filled environment where children can grow spiritually while building friendships. This year we were blessed to expand our volunteer team, allowing us to divide the children into two age-based Bible lesson groups to better engage each stage of development.

Pastor Doug Gilmore led Bible teaching for grades 2–5, allowing older students to explore Scripture more deeply and engage in meaningful discussion. Amy Ashe led children ages 3 through 1st grade, providing age-appropriate lessons designed to help younger children understand God's love in ways that connect with their hearts and minds. Linda Gilmore continued to lead craft time and Katie Matthews stepped into leading games and activities. We are especially grateful for our many parent volunteers who faithfully served each Wednesday night and helped the ministry run smoothly.



Kids Klub concluded the year with a celebration at Funplex—always a favorite tradition and a wonderful opportunity to celebrate growth, friendships and God's blessings. As we look ahead, we are excited to continue strengthening this ministry while creating room to welcome and disciple new children and families.

Children's Church

Children's Church continues to be led by four faithful volunteer teams serving throughout each month during Sunday worship. Each Sunday experience includes Bible teaching, activities, crafts and snacks designed specifically for children, while also allowing parents to fully engage in worship and the sermon. Our goal is not simply childcare during worship—it is intentional discipleship. We want children to discover that church is a place where they belong, where God loves them deeply and where faith becomes part of everyday life.

Safe Sanctuary

This year Wiley Church implemented Safe Sanctuary, a policy focused on creating the safest possible environment for children and youth ministries. All volunteers serving with children and youth are completing background checks and child safety training. We remain committed to providing parents confidence and reassurance that Wiley Church is intentionally striving to provide every child a true "Safe Sanctuary." Completion of volunteer screenings and training is expected by end of June 2026. Creating safe spaces today helps shape strong faith foundations for tomorrow.

Communion and Baptism Class

In March 2026, Wiley Church held its first Communion and Baptism Class since before the pandemic. Designed for children in grades 2–6, the class helped children understand the biblical meaning and significance of Communion and Baptism as foundational expressions of faith. Pastor Sam and Pastor Doug taught these important truths together, helping children begin building lifelong understanding of these sacred moments in their faith journey.

A special highlight came when the children baked communion bread with their families before participating in their First Communion on May 3, 2026. It was a meaningful and memorable worship experience for both children and families—a reminder that faith is not simply taught but experienced together.

Activities and Family Connection

Children participated throughout the year in Christmas Eve, Palm Sunday and Easter worship services. One of our goals is helping children understand they are an important part of the larger church family—not only participants in children’s ministry but active members of God’s church today. Family connection also remains an important priority. Our February Family Game Night was well attended and filled with laughter, fellowship and community-building—with many requests already made for another event.

Upcoming summer opportunities include:

- Kids Klub Pool Party
- Outdoor Family Movie Night
- Family Phillies Game

These moments strengthen relationships while creating joyful memories connected to church life and faith.

Mom’s Group

Mom’s Group began in Fall 2025 and has continued to grow through monthly gatherings that provide encouragement, support, friendship and spiritual connection. Many moms involved in the children’s programs participate regularly and new moms from outside the church have also expressed interest in joining. Our prayer is that this ministry continues growing into a place of discipleship, strength and Christ-centered encouragement—impacting families not only today but for generations to come.

Looking Ahead

At Wiley Church, children’s ministry is more than programs—it is planting seeds of faith. Every lesson taught, every volunteer serving, every family encouraged and every child welcomed is part of shaping lives with God’s love for today and preparing hearts to follow Christ for tomorrow.

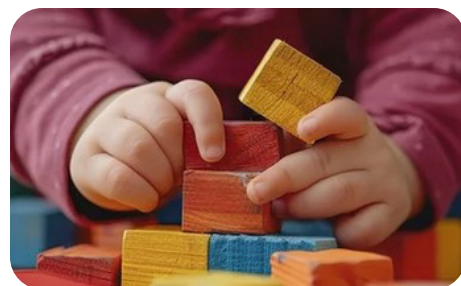

Preschool/Day Camp/ Children’s Ministries

Nurturing the next generation

At Wiley Preschool, we are continually reminded that our calling extends far beyond the classroom. Rooted in faith and guided by compassion, we strive each day to create a nurturing environment where children and families feel deeply loved, supported, and cared for. This year, our theme, “Known for Compassion, Trusted for Care,” has reflected the heart of our ministry as we have partnered with families to help children grow academically, socially, emotionally and spiritually. Through everyday moments of kindness, encouragement, and service, we seek to model the love of Christ in all that we do.

This school year also brought new challenges for Wiley Preschool as several publicly funded preschool programs opened within our township, resulting in a decline in enrollment and requiring us to thoughtfully adapt and make changes within our program. Yet, through every transition, our mission and heart for ministry have



remained unchanged. We have remained deeply committed to providing each child with individualized attention, nurturing support, and a Christ-centered environment where they feel safe, valued, and loved. While circumstances around us may shift, our dedication to caring for children and families with compassion and excellence has not wavered.

Matthew 5:16 reminds us, “**Let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in Heaven.**” This scripture has served as a meaningful foundation for our school community through the year. Whether through the dedication of our teachers, the trust of our families, or the joy and curiosity seen in each child, God’s light continues to shine through Wiley Preschool. We are grateful for the continued support of our church and school families and remain committed to providing compassionate care and Christ-centered learning for every child entrusted to us.

This past year we had the blessing of watching over 41 students during the school year and 50 campers during our Summer Camp. I cannot thank the preschool staff enough for all the effort, care, creativity, and patience that they displayed this year.

Behavioral Management/ Adult Day Services

Compassion in Every Step

At the heart of the Behavioral Management Program is a simple truth: compassionate care creates the conditions for healing. Each day, we support individuals facing mental health challenges by providing not only clinical treatment, but consistency, dignity, and hope.

Our program is built on support and stability. Many individuals enter our program during periods of significant disruption—facing housing instability, following psychiatric hospitalization, social isolation, or difficulty maintaining daily functioning. We aim to be a steady presence. Through structured services including case management, therapeutic groups, and medication management, we create a safe and reliable environment where individuals can begin to rebuild.

We also prioritize connection. Recovery doesn’t happen in isolation. Our program fosters a sense of community where Individuals feel seen, heard, and valued. Whether through group therapy, shared meals, or small daily interactions, we emphasize that no one has to navigate their journey alone. In a world where many feel isolated, we intentionally create spaces of belonging that often become a catalyst for growth.

Our work leads to meaningful transformation, helping individuals regain functioning, reclaiming parts of themselves that may have been lost to illness, increasing confidence, and a sense of purpose. Progress may be gradual, but it is meaningful.

Over the past year:

- The majority of participants demonstrated improved treatment adherence and engagement.
- We saw a reduction in psychiatric hospitalizations among active participants.
- Many individuals achieved increased independence, including improved daily living skills and community integration.

These outcomes reflect not only clinical effectiveness, but the trust built between staff and those we serve. Compassion is not simply a feeling- it is an action we take every day. It is found in the patience of our staff, the respect we show each individual, and our commitment to meeting people where they are without judgement.

As reflected in **Psalms 34:18**, “**The Lord is close to the brokenhearted and saves those who are crushed in spirit**”.



This message reflects the spirit of our work: meeting individuals in their most vulnerable moments with unwavering support. We are proud to be a program known for compassion and trusted for care, and we remain committed to walking alongside those we serve- every step of the way.
